- ✓ Schools & Home Schoolers must follow the ACE Student Convention Guidelines for dress and competition but do not have to be using the ACE curriculum to compete.
- ✓ School **Registration Fee of \$100.00** is only **\$50** when paid by **October 11, 2024** (non-refundable). Schools must register by **October 11** so we can build their school portal for them to upload their students' events. After **October 25**, events can be dropped but can not be added.
- ✓ Cost: **\$50.00/Student** competing due **October 25, 2024**. **\$10** charge for pre-registered guests and sponsors due **October 25, 2024**.
- ✓ There will be a gate charge of **\$15** per person per day for un-registered guests. **No charge for Judges.**

SECURE INFORMATION in a three-ring binder for easy access:

1. Print this document for reference and place in the front of your notebook.
2. Print a copy of the Student Registration Form for each eligible student.
3. Print a copy of the Volunteer Convention Judges Form and give to each potential adult.
4. Go to the ACE website (www.aceministries.com) and print the guidelines for each event.



EARLY BIRD GETS THE WORM!

At a Parent/Teacher meeting share with the parents the advantages of student convention and ask your parents for help. Have the parents fill out the **PICTURE/VIDEO PERMISSION FORM** for their student(s).

SELECT EVENTS

BALANCING INDIVIDUAL DEVELOPMENT WITH SCHOOL NEEDS:

1. Give students a copy of the Student Registration Form and have them select their events.
2. Go over with each student their chosen events and, if needed, add events.
3. Group students in group events.
4. Print or copy rules and judging criteria for each individual by event selected and have them maintain a personal convention preparation notebook or folder.
5. Print judges form as reference to evaluation breakdown for each event— use as part of your preparation criteria.
6. By the first of September begin memory work and practice on performance selections.
7. By the first of October finalize necessary paperwork for projects. This is an excellent time to complete permission forms and get signatures from parents.
8. By the middle of October have a special Parent/Teacher's Fellowship to share all your students hard work. Have a special offering to help with expenses.
